ORAL HISTORIES & PROFESSIONAL INTERVIEWS

We have now completed all oral history interviews with **community members**, primarily from Romany Gypsy and Irish Traveller communities (with a small number of Showmen and New Travellers). These have included oral histories with community members currently in prison and on probation.

We have now completed all interviews with **professionals** who have worked with Gypsy and Traveller communities. We are in the process of analysing the data received.

SURVEY

The **confidential survey** started in April 2023. To date we have completed 365 out of the 400 surveys required.

Research assistants and community researchers in Devon and Cornwall will be out in August completing the final surveys.

We aim to complete all surveys by 31st August 2023.
